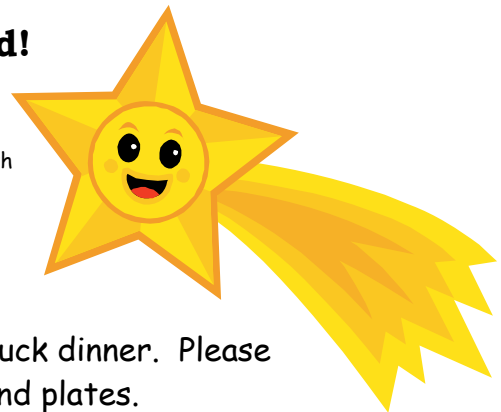

Bettye Hyde will be closed from Friday December 18th and will re-open on Monday January 4th

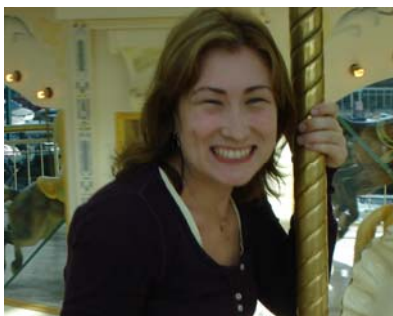
Trivia Nite Raises \$4,000!

The teachers would like to welcome and introduce Leah Cooke, a student from Algonquin... Here is her bio

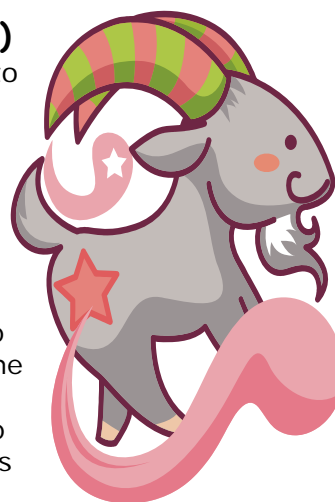

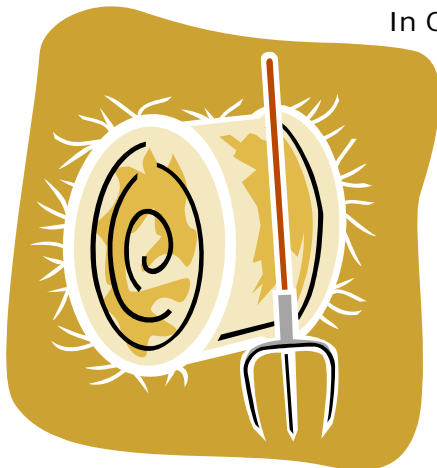
An Update on School Trips and Outings
